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Mary Becker began her artistic career as a fiber and textile artist. Her work includes embroidery, life-sized soft sculpture, off loom weaving, jewelry and clothing. She has taught these techniques in both southern California and Alaska.

Mary's multi-media fiber art has been sold in galleries and gift shops, and her embroidery designs have been licensed by the Paragon and Bucilla brands. She has designed robes, stoles, chasubles and paraments for churches and ministers seeking one-of-a-kind vestments. While working in the toy industry, Mary created, prototyped and brought to market talking toys, plush, children's books & audio materials and products for properties such as Teddy Ruxpin, Mickey Mouse and Mother Goose.

Now, experimenting with collage and assemblage, Mary is exploring new techniques and materials in a series of Travel Bags which celebrate the small moments and important occasions that mark our passage through life.
